a. Hurricane Update.....PBC Emergency Management

Executive Director Bill Johnson

Executive Director Bill Johnson provides the general membership with a hurricane update for 2020. There are 4 tips to assist citizens in preparing for this hurricane season which are: Have a plan, have a kit, stay informed, and get involved. It's the same process every hurricane season. He advises that if we have to evacuate do not leave town and that there are many stable buildings in Palm Beach County. The current hurricane shelters may open all at once for this upcoming hurricane season and due to Covid-19 the CDC's recommendations will be practiced. The following were additional protocols that would be practiced at the hurricane shelters such as:

- Face coverings will be provided and mandatory at all shelters
- Hand sanitizer stations will be available at all shelters

- Water bottle stations will be available
- Screenings will take place prior to entering
- Isolation areas will take place prior to entering
- Increased sanitation efforts like cleaning every hour
- Minimal contact at administration

Finally, the pet shelter setup will be different this time with pets going to the West Boynton Recreational center and their owners going to the shelter at the Park Vista High School. He urges the general membership to go to the FEMA website for their updates. Also, he suggests membership to check out the PBC Alerts app that provides the latest news, weather conditions, and road closures throughout Palm Beach County.
